Mrs. Cinglio another resident of the Brookhaven Subdivision feels that the City is not holding the builders responsible for the roads they are working on. Mayor Howard will contact City Attorney Erskine Funderburg and have Erskine contact Mr. Pittard who has taken over for Four Star. Mrs. Cinglio still feels that the City needs to be more diligent when it comes to builders and road conditions. Mrs. Moore is not happy about the City being able to enforce road issues because the roads have not been accepted by the City of Margaret. Mrs. Cinglio asked whether or not the HOA have any funds to make builders have more accountability.

Mr. Barker gave the Council an update on the progress of the New City Hall.

Pedro Pino informed the Council of the success of the Health Fair, and also of the raffle sponsored by the Lions Club to send a child with Diabetes to a Diabetes Camp. The raffle tickets are \$10.00.
